Egypt

DR El Rayes is Professor of Ophthalmology, Institute of Ophthalmology in Cairo. He received his medical degree with honor from Ein Shams University. He completed his Ophthalmology training and residency in Cairo University hospital. Dr El Rayes had his master degree in Ophthalmology from Cairo University after which he joined the Associated Retinal Consultants with its great faculty in Royal Oak Michigan for his vitreoretinal fellowship in 1993. He also had a year of research fellowship in Research Eye Institute, Oakland University, Rochester Michigan, U.S.A 1994. He received his Ph.D. degree in 1995.

Dr El Rayes is on faculty in the Institute of Ophthalmology in Cairo, joining and participating as primary investigator in clinical trials nationally and internationally, with special interest in diabetic retinopathy, retinal detachment and pediatric retinal surgery. Serves as a vitreoretinal surgeon in the Retina service in the eye institute hospital, International Eye Hospital.. He is an innovator of the 23 g fragmatome as well as the innovator of the suprachoroidal surgergical techniques and product line. He is a founder of the Arab African Society of Retina Specialists (AASRS), Member of the American Academy of Ophthalmology (AAO), Member of the Association for Research in Vision and Ophthalmology (ARVO), Member of the European Vitreo Retina Society (EVRS), Member of the American society of Retina Specialists (ASRS), Member of the Egyptian Ophthalmological Society, Member of the Club Vit., Member of the Pan Arab, African Ophthalmological Council. He is the liaison leader for the American society of retina specialists serving Africa and middle east. He receive Amin El Maghraby award: Egyptian Ophthalmologic Society Meeting 2001. International education award: American Academy of Ophthalmology 2010. International scholar award: American Academy of Ophthalmology, Honor Award: American Society of Retina specialist 2011 and the Senior Honor Award: American Society of Retina specialist 2014: American Academy of Ophthalmology achievement award 2015. As of today Dr El Rayes is a professor in the institute of Ophthalmology, sharing with his colleges teaching and fellow training, publications journal reviews, Book chapters and executive committee for a number educational and research committees.

He is currently practising as Retina Specialist and Ophthalmology Director at Organizacion Medica de Investigacion (Medical Organization of Investigation), Buenos Aires, Argentina.

He completed his graduation and post-graduation in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Subsequently, he went on to do his Ophthalmology Research Fellowship at the prestigious Moorfields Eye Hospital, London.

He completed a Clinical Trials Design course from London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. He has been a Principal Investigator in 14 global Clinical Trials (Phase III) in Wet AMD, DME, Imaging, Uveitis, GA, etc.

Some of these include RISE / RIDE, VIEW – 2 and OPH1003 (FOVISTA).

He has close to 30 publications to his credit including Long-term Outcomes of Ranibizumab Therapy for DME:36-month results from two phase III trials: RISE and RIDE.

Dr. Rupesh Agrawal


Dr Rupesh Agrawal, is practising as Consultant Ophthalmologist at National Healthcare Group Eye Institute, Tan Tock Seng Hospital, Singapore. After completing his medical studies from Nagpur, he did his postgraduation and fellowship in Uveitis and Ocular trauma from Sankara Netralaya, Chennai. He was subsequently working as Consultant Ophthalmogist (Uveitis, Ocular Trauma and Cataract) at Shri Ganapati Netralaya, Jalna. He also worked briefly at L V Prasad Eye Institute before migrating to Singapore in 2009. Subsequently he is working in Singapore and has been involved in significant translational and basic science research projects. He completed his overseas research training fellowship - awarded by National Medical Research Council Scholarship, Ministry of Health, Singapore at University College London on retinal imaging using retinal leukogram and erythrogram projects. He is also working on mechanical properties of the red blood cell and its implications in microvascular disorders. As a visiting Professor, he also had an opportunity to work with Prof Carlos Pavesio and accomplished numerous research projects at prestigious Moorfields Eye Hospital, London, UK. He has done Global Scholars Research Training from prestigious Harvard Medical School. His areas of interest are Ocular inflammatory disorders including cytokines, ocular tuberculosis and HIV, complex cataract, ocular trauma, ocular nanotechnology, blood corpuscular abnormalities in context of microvascular disorders and retinal imaging. He is also trying to look at 'Choroidal Vascularity Index' based on choroidal imaging using optical coherence tomography. He has published extensively on ocular inflammation and ocular trauma in peer reviewed journals and has presented numerous free papers and delivered lectures on Ocular trauma and Uveitis both nationally and internationally. He has to his credit 150+ peer reviewed publications and 50+ book chapters. He is actively involved in numerous collaborative projects on uveitis. He is recipient of many grants for numerous basic science projects pertinent to ocular inflammation. He is currently secretary of International Society of Ocular trauma. He has been recipient of many awards and research grants. He was also conferred with Healthcare Humanity Award by President of Singapore in 2011 for his humanitarian and probono projects in remote areas of the world. He is also involved heavily in charity projects across Asia.


